Guest Speaker



Congratulations to the members of the Filipino-American Association of Greater Columbia for organizing this annual gala event to celebrate the rich cultural heritage of the Philippines and raise funds to support the organization's scholarship, cultural and charitable programs. Like many immigrants before them, Filipinos came to the United States seeking educational and job opportunities. But they did not leave the Philippines behind. They brought with them recipes for chicken adobo and pancit. They continued to wear the barong tagalog--that embroidered long-sleeve man's shirt made of cloth ingeniously crafted from pineapple leaf fibers—on formal occasions. They carried a myriad of instruments fashioned of bamboo. Among themselves, they adapted food, clothing, musical and dance traditions to a new cultural context and forged a sense of community that they now proudly invited us—their South Carolina friends, neighbors, and colleagues—to share. We are all the richer for gatherings such as these!

With my mother's family having immigrated from Northern Ireland to South Carolina prior to the Revolutionary War (1775), I have deep roots in the music and craft traditions of this state. My grandfather's Primitive Baptist Church congregation sang what's called shaped-note music. This was a form of religious music sung without musical accompaniment. And one of my grandfather's sisters—my Aunt Ida—was the quilter in the family. She had a wooden quilting frame on rope pulleys that she lowered down from the ceiling of her living room when she was ready to stitch the three layers of a quilt together. So it comes as no surprise that I eventually found myself researching and performing shape note music and took up making and writing about quilts as a form of women's expressive culture.

Yet while being steeped in the cultural traditions of the southeastern US, I also share with many of you the experience of being a first generation American. My father immigrated to the US on September 1, 1939, the day Germany invaded Poland. Growing up I spent many holidays at my grandparents' home in Glassport, PA where Polish was spoken with English over meals of stuffed cabbage and pierogi. After several Iron City beers, my grandfather would regale us with songs he learned in a Russian prisoner of war camp during WWI. Even now my father will occasionally sing scraps of songs he sang in his youth while playing the accordion in a band that performed for Polish American gatherings. Unfortunately, we didn't speak Polish in our household, and I never learned to play the accordion. But I do still make stuffed cabbage for the holidays using the recipe I jotted down while watching my grandmother cook without a recipe. Like you who have come to this evening's gala, I pay homage the people and cultural traditions that have shaped how I experience being a citizen of South Carolina, but also of the world.

TINIKLING

The National dance of the Philippines. A traditional folk dance which is named after a bird, "tikling, "that is native to the Philippines. The dance imitates the movements of the bird as it tries to escape the trap laid by the farmers. The dance involves at least two people beating, tapping, and sliding bamboo poles on the ground and against each other in coordination with one or more dancers who step over and in between the poles in a dance.

Mindanao Dance





SINGKIL

Originates from the Maranao people of Lake Lanao in the southern region of Mindanao. This timeless and popular Muslium royal dance feature a prince and a princess and show them weave in and out of crisscrossed bamboo poles clapped in syncopated rhythm. The lady holds a fan and have an entourage that follows her around.

PANGALAY

Also known as Daling-Daling or Mengalai in Sabah. Pangalay literally means a gift offering and also means "temple of dance" in Sanskrit. Pangalay antedates Christianity and Islam in the Philippines. This traditional Tausig (of the Sulu Archipelago) dance is distinct because it is characterized by hand movements that resemble the movement of ocean waves, enhanced by long, metal fingernails worn by the dancers.

There are different kinds of Pangalay dances: Pangalay linggisan, is performed by a solo female dancer imitating the movement of a bird in flight; Pangalay courtship dance is performed by a male and female dancer imitating the graceful courtship dance of birds, and Pangalay ha patung, which involves dancing on elevated bamboo poles, reminiscent of the royal Singkil

NIEVES MCNULTY

Nieves Austria McNulty is a retired Math Professor having taught at the University of the Philippines Los Banos, USC Aiken and Columbia College. Nieves was born in Roxas City to a mother from Iloilo and a father from Pangasinan. She also lived in Lingayen Pangasinan and Quezon City. She obtained her math degrees from UP Diliman and USC. She was married for 41 years to George McNulty, who recently passed away, with two children Allison and Michael. Nieves is a lifetime member of FAAGC and has served as its president (1997-2001) and treasurer (2009-2013). Her husband George had likewise been an active member of FAAGC having served as treasurer and as a member of the dance troupe.

The kulintang is an instrument consisting usually of eight gongs with diameters between 7 and 9 inches and a height of 3 inches that are laid out in a row. It is the main instrument of an ensemble with 3 or 4 other larger gongs that hang vertically, and some drums. These instruments were used during festivities for entertainment and to accompany dance performances. Traditionally, it's the women who played the kulintang while men played the other instrument. Nowadays there are more men playing it.

I've had these gongs for about 25 years now but it was only after Imelda Go built a base for it and persuaded me to learn to play it and to perform at today's gala. I foolishly said 'sure, how hard can it be'. Fortunately in my research about the instrument, I found that there are no standards regarding how or what to play. So tonight I will be playing for you my "Improvisation #0.001"

A Columbia Fil-Am Vouth Scholarship program has been discussed often since the formation of the Association in 1991. Officially Started in 2002 by the FAAGC Executive Board through the initiative of Peter Liunoras (FAAGC President, 2001-2003), the Columbia Fil-Am Scholarship awards are given to Fil-Am college-bound high school graduates whose families are currently paid FAAGC members and who (or their parents) have participated actively in Fil-Am activities. As specified by the executive Board recently, current criteria are involvement in FAAGC (50 percent), academics (30 percent), and interview and essay (20 percent).

Funds for the scholarship program are generated from, among others, donations, raffles during FAAGC gala, Christmas and Valentine's Day events, food sales at basketball tournaments, and from 2004 to 2010, fund-raisers by the Ridge View High School (RVHS) Fil-Am Youth Club under the directions of Peter Liunoras.

Starting in 2021, long-time member and supporter Dr. Francisco Sy has established and endowed the Dr. Francisco S. Sy Scholarship Fund of the FAAGC.

FAAGC presented the first Columbia Fil-AM Scholarship award at the 13th Annual Gala on September 13, 2003. Since then, award certificates (and checks) have been presented to deserving and qualified students every year during the annual gala or at special events. Interestingly, most of the past scholarship recipients had been Columbia Fil-Am Cultural Dance Troupe performers at one time or another.





The Philippines was the best summer trip in a while for me. Although, the flight was long and boring. I could tell when we got there because of the many islands as you entered the Philippine airspace. We went to so many cool places and learned about our heritage.

We saw the beautiful part of the Philippines. It's very different from the U.S. There are a lot of cars, but because of the traffic, many people use motorcycles. The public transportation is a lot different; they use jeepneys and tricycles. A tricycle is a motorcycle attached to a little cart. It's good for transporting people and goods. A jeepney is a vehicle with a long cushion seat on both sides. We saw the beautiful part of the Philippines. Beautiful Beaches. The beaches and islands are breathtaking. The water is as blue as the sky, and the islands abound with tropical plants. The coral reefs in the Philippines are also the most colorful. The sand at some beaches is almost as white as sugar. When the water is still, you can see straight through. There is an excellent variety of different colors and sizes of fish. I also got to swim with a sea turtle (pawikan). You can swim in 10-ft deep water, but when you look behind, the depth seems endless.

The best vacation spot was Coron, Palawan. It is a small island group with lots of beautiful spots. The locals are friendly, and many street sellers sell jewelry. Some people will give you a private tour on their boat for a reasonable price. You can buy food in the market, and they can cook it for you on the boat.

As true with other places, not all in the Philippines is beautiful. I saw little kids selling things on the streets wearing tattered clothes, which made me sad.

The Mountains. There are also lots of mountains in the area. They are amusing to climb, and the view is amazing. Also, these mountains collect lots of water when it rains. So, there are springs with fresh and very cold water. It feels rejuvenating when you're in it.

Unique Philippines. The Philippines has so many types of food. They have many dishes like pansit bato, buko pie, and many fish-related dishes. We went to the local market my tatay went to daily when he was my age. The markets have so many fruits and foods I have never heard of. There are dogs everywhere. There are many local places (karenderia) to eat too.

Also, regular activities are different, like showering. They have a bucket of water (balde) and a cup (tabo) you pour water from. You can't adjust the temperature of the water either. While in the Philippines, I noticed you could be in a city with tall buildings and huge malls. But driving 15 minutes away, you can see rice fields everywhere.

Family. The best thing about the Philippines is that I reconnected with family members I hadn't seen in years. At first, I thought my family was small, but now that I visited the Philippines, I know I have the best, biggest, and most loving family ever.

At the end of the trip, I learned a lot about the Philippines' history and why we are so persistent, smart, and strong. It made me proud of who I am. - Joaquin Vejerano (Youth cultural performer since 2017, 8th grader).

The Philippines is a beautiful country with a rich cultural heritage, breathtaking tourist sites, and delicious food. This past summer, I had the opportunity to explore my roots and rediscover the beauty of my parent's country. I reconnected with families I hadn't seen in over a decade. I also practiced my Tagalog a bit, even though it's still.

Growing up in the U.S., I thought I had a small family consisting of only my nanay, tatay, and Joaquin. Little did I know that waiting for me in the Philippines was a huge group of loving people. It had been so long since I had last seen them. It was amazing to hug and reconnect with them. We visited family friends and visited Jose Rizal's home, too. I got to talk to my numerous titas and titos, who couldn't believe how much I had grown since my last visit. I spent time with my cousins. But most of all, I got to spend time with my Lola Nanay, one of the most amazing women I had ever met. She was one of the strongest women who single-handedly raised my number one role model.

The Philippines has many different faces hidden from others. From one perspective, the Philippines is a beautiful vacation spot with many world-class white sand beaches and resorts.

Experiencing the Philippines from my perspective as a "tourist" was amazing. We hopped from island to island. I got to dive around coral reefs in Coron, Palawan. I swam with tropical fish; I even got to swim beside a massive sea turtle that appeared out of the blue.

From my perspective as a Filipino, the Philippines isn't pure beauty and bliss. I realized the differences between the Philippines and the U.S. The most striking is the big disparity between people. You could be walking around town, suddenly passing a woman wearing designer clothes and drinking an iced coffee. A moment later, I passed a group of kids sitting outside a restaurant eating on cardboard. Seeing these kids broke my heart.

When staying with my nanay's family in Los Baños, I learned how traveling could be uncomfortable because many drivers hardly follow traffic rules, resulting in disorganized traffic. What should have been a 10-minute drive took almost 30 minutes. This frustrated me. I realized that living in the Philippines is challenging in some aspects.

Despite the lack of the usual comfort that one experiences in the U.S., visiting the Philippines was my most amazing experience so far. It was like rediscovering a hidden part of me. It allowed me to reconnect with family, explore the country, and experience what it offered. If I could do it all again, I would do so in a heartbeat. After all, no matter where you were born and regardless of age, we need to rediscover our roots and understand our origin.

ELIGIO (Jun) DAVID, JR. -- was one of the pioneer members of the Association and became one of the first Excutive Board members in 1991-92. His family members were all active members of the organization until they moved out of state. Jun passed away in the Philippines in 2014.

Dr. REMY MORALES SARMIENTO -- Another pioneer member and FAAGC Treasurer from 1991-92 and part of 1993, she was one of three Honorary Lifetime Membership Awardees of FAAGC during its 25th Anniversay. Remy was instrumental in the founding of FAAGC. Initial meetings every first Sunday of the month were held at her Spring Valley residence in Columbia prior to the actual formal first election of officers in June 15, 1991. Her residence was at one point called the "birthplace of FAAGC." Dr. Sarmiento was a psychiatrist at the SC State Hospital and a director of one of the nursing homes in the Columbia Area. She and her family and sisters were all very active members of FAAGC until they moved to Texas 3 years later. Even after moving to Texas, she continued to send her financial support to FAAGC until she passed away on October 15, 2020. If Remy had remained in Columbia, I bet we would have our own building already as she was one of those who was very supportive of the idea.

Dr. TESSIE DE CASTRO -- Executive Board Member in 1992-93, First Vice-President 2001-2003 and a Lifetime Sustaining Charter Member since 1991. She was a psychiatrist at the SC State Hospital. She also continued financial supporter until she moved to Plano, Texas to be with her children. She passed away in November 8, 2020.

DOMINADOR PEREZ -- Executive Board Member for two consecutive terms in 1992-93 and 1993-94. He and his wife, Zenen Perez who was a pediatrician at Fort Jackson, were both very active members until they moved to Richmond, Virginia few years later. Dom passed away in Dec.26, 2019.

ERNEST (Gene) ELLIS -- served as First Vice President in 1996-97 and Executive Board Member in 1997-99. Gene was an incredible First VP during my 3rd term. I don't remember anything we disagreed on as far as what to do with the organization. Both Lifetime Sustaining Charter Members since 1991, he and wife Sally were both very active members, with Sally herself serving as our secretary in 1992-93 and First VP in 1996-1997. At one point we had a brief conversation when he said to me "I don't know how you do this all, Helen, when you you have two young school children, a full-time job (I was a nurse) and a house to take care of. You still can do all of these." I said "I'm lucky, Gene, because I have a husband who supported me all the way." Gene retired from the military and insurance business. He passed away on November 20, 2016.

ROGER LAWSIN -- Executive Board Member 1999-2000. He was an off-and-on member of FAAGC. His family hosted a welcome get-together at their Wildewood residence for then Philippine Ambassador to the US Willie Gaa when he was our first Philippine dignitary to attend the FAAGC gala in 1999. His wife, Dr. Rosen has been a member since 2020, now a Lifetime member and has been supportive of FAAGC activities since then. Roger was a lawyer in the Philippines before moving to the US and retired from real estate business in Columbia. He passed away on April 16, 2019.

Remembering Our Departed FAAGC Leaders

WILLIAM (Bill) T. SIMMONS -- Joined FAAGC in early 1994, AND WAS elected Executive Board Member in 1996-97 and 2nd VP in 1999-2001. Bill was very active member even before he married his Filipina wife. He became one of our official photographers during his term. Bill retired from the US Air Force and a lifetime Tuskeege Airmen Association member. His wife Gemma was at one point joined the cultural dance troupe. He and his wife Gemma were active members until he became sick. He passed away on June 13, 2019.

GALEN MANAPAT -- Served as Executive Board Member in 2005-2007. Although his father was a Filipino, he was born in NewYork. He served in the US Navy for 3 years, studied at the now CIU and worked at USC as the HVAC Director. He noted that "although I'm not a Filipino, I joined the Fil-Am because I appreciated that the Filipino culture differs from Americans." He wanted to make some friends "to get the pulse of the group so I can make suggestions to make FAAGC more vibrant and active." He passed away on Oct. 23, 2020.

APOLONIA (Polly) PEARSON -- A Lifetime Sustaining Member since 1992, she served as Treasurer in 1993-94, Executive Board Member in 1994-95 and Assistant Treasurer in 2001-2003. She was probably one of the most active FAAGC members (if not the most) who was not a Columbia resident. Although she lived in the Sumter area, she managed to be very active, attended almost every activities we had. Whether social, fundraising, or community service, Polly was always there. She managed to attend both monthly membership and EB meetings and was instrumental in bringing in most of Sumter residents' attendance and involvement with FAAGC activities. Her daughter LeeAnn also became a member of the Cultural Dance Troupe in 1996. Polly continued to be active and supportive of FAAGC activites until she passed away on March 9, 2021.

Dr. GEORGE MCNULTY --- He and his family were one of the 18 Sustaining Lifetime Charter Members of FAAGC since 1991. George was the longest serving Treasurer from 2001-2007, and served as 2nd Vice President in 2007-2009. As a treasurer, he held that position with great trust and accountancy. As a member there was nothing you could not depend on him -from grilling the burgers during picnics, setting up and cleaning up during Christmas parties and Columbia International Festivals, to being emcee during cultural dance performances, a Kalayaan Show cast member, and even part of the entertaiment team during Christmas parties. He joined the FAAGC Young-at-Heart Dance troupe in later years. He also became the faculty adviser to the Filipino-American Student Association (FASA) at University of South Carolina in 2004 -2005. Because of all these involvement, he recieved the International Community Ambassador Award from the Columbia International Festival Committee in 2006. In addition to his outstanding professional academic achievements (math professor at USC), I can say he was the most active non-Filipino that ever became a member and officer of FAAGC. His wife Nieves also served two terms as FAAGC President from 1997-2001 and 2 terms as Treasurer from 2009-2013. Their two children both became members of the Cultural Dance Troupe. George passed away last June 13, 2023.
